

## **BRAVO RECEIVER: WHAT DO I DO FOR PROBLEMS OR QUESTIONS?**

**For urgent medical issues**, day or night, such as severe pain, bleeding, vomiting, fever, etc. which you believe might be related to your procedure, or if you have urgent needs regarding Bravo receiver alarms or function after hours, after attempting the measures outlined below, please call your endoscopy physician at their phone number provided below:

### **Troubleshooting**

<b><u>Problem</u></b>	<b><u>Tip</u></b>
Bravo receiver beeps for 30 sec. or Receiver window flashing time or “C1” “P1” message.	Hold receiver near your chest to re-set. Flashing should stop leaving only the time constantly displayed. If still flashing, reposition yourself and/or the receiver away from possible sources of interference. (clock/radio, cell phone, microwave) and place near your chest again to re-set.
Don’t remember which button to push or where to write things on Bravo diary.	The symptom buttons are labeled at the top of your diary pages for reference. If still uncertain just write start and stop times of symptoms and activities somewhere on your diary page. The nurse can enter them into the computer manually when the study is complete.
Heartburn	Document heartburn on diary pages or by pressing the appropriate receiver button. <b>DO NOT</b> take antacids.
Mild discomfort or mildly difficult swallowing.	Chew food well and rinse down with fluids. May take Tylenol for discomfort.
Severe throat, chest or abdominal pain, significant difficulty swallowing, fever or bleeding..	Call your endoscopy physician at the number above.
